**Midwife Pilgrim, Inc. had three midwives travel to Kenya to provide clinical support. We feel strongly that maintaining the safety of our global partners and their communities is paramount and did not encourage travel during this time unless strict isolation and all travel requirements could be met. Even with travel bans lifted, the pandemic continued to effect vulnerable populations and our commitment to ensure communities remained safe and healthy was our priority.**

**The brutal and continuous attack on Ukraine brought about more requests from NGOs on the ground, but unfortunately, many of the programs we work with had to pull back because of safety issues. We did not personally raise funds for the Ukraine effort but did direct donors to organizations we felt were making a difference including hospitals within Ukraine that were requesting financial support, World Central Kitchen and the UNHCR.**

**2022 also brought about more changes. In May, Midwife Pilgrim, Inc. became Global Midwife Response, Inc. We felt that as the world has changed, so should we. Going forward we plan to continue our support with clinical care but 2023 and beyond will also see a focus on low resource reproductive health education and preparation. We at Global Midwife Response are excited as we embark in this new direction and focus.**

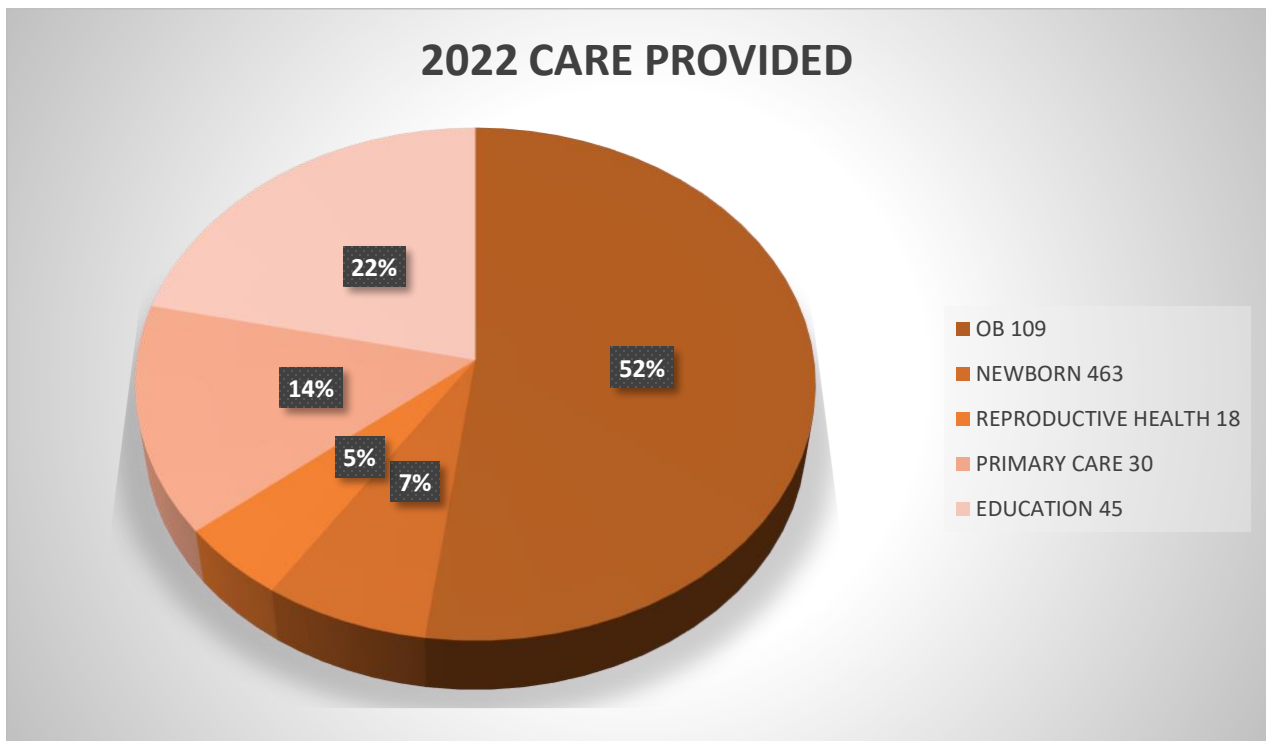

## Global Midwife Response Inc. 2022 Annual report

### Our Work

Three midwives traveled to Kenya in 2022, providing clinical care and mentorship. One midwife provided virtual training in reproductive health topics to a health center in Uganda. Other midwives have been working on educational programs that we will be offering in 2023 to further the skills that reproductive health providers need to provide care in low resource and disaster situations.



Through the generosity of private donors and one grant, Global Midwife Response, Inc. raised \$8269.34 in 2022. Our expenses of \$7722.42 went directly to ensuring our programming continues, even if still mainly on hold. This ensured PPE, medications, equipment, and supplies were available to our global partners.
