2015 Annual Financial Report

Three midwives with a vision finally took the first steps in June of 2015 to create a place where midwives who want to serve have the support and resources they need and communities in crisis or disaster stricken areas have access to skilled and compassionate care. Very quickly word spread and we found ourselves with volunteers ready to serve and a global community ready to step up and offer the financial support the needed to ensure women and infants are not forgotten or without care.

This was the year of Ebola and we began by developing a curriculum at the request of larger NGOs in Sierra Leone and Liberia to help train healthcare workers with safe birth practices during this epidemic.

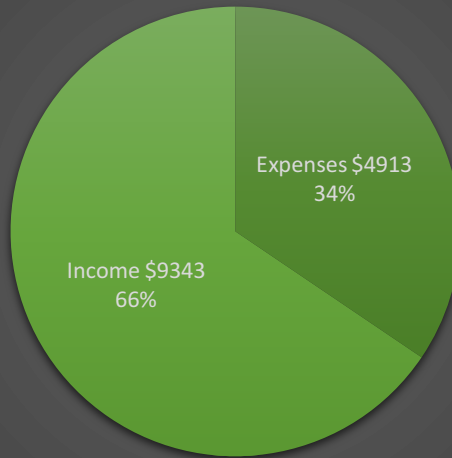
Soon we found ourselves with a request to offer support in Nepal who had experienced 2 devastating earthquakes earlier that spring. We were able to do a thorough assessment of the work needed there as they rebuild their country and bring essential supplies, equipment and donations of infant clothing and diapers. We also worked with Global Orphan Prevention who has been tirelessly working to rebuild clinics destroyed in the most rural and difficult to reach places. A direct donation was given to them to help with their project.

We began sending midwives to Greece in November of 2015 to the island of Lesbos where upwards of 10,000 people a day arrived fleeing their war torn nations. After helping to set up the first women's focused clinic in a large camp there we were able to focus on other locations and found ourselves making connections throughout Greece and Western Turkey where care was urgently needed.

Through the generosity of concerned people who wanted to find a way to help, we raised \$9343 in a few short months. This does not include the donations of supplies, equipment and clothing we were able to send to Nepal and Greece. Administrative expenses including registering our incorporation and getting our 501(c)3 status as well as office fees totaled \$1089 for the year. Our Program expenses which covers on ground support such as transportation and supplies/medications totaled \$3824. Many of our donations came toward the end of our fiscal year and we ended 2015 with a healthy buffer of \$4430 to ensure our programs were able to continue.

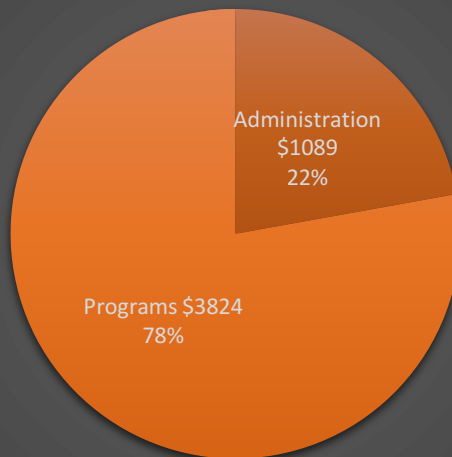
Because our receipts totaled less than \$50,000, we were able to file form 990N to the IRS and did so early February 2016.
